By entering your film into SCINEMA 2010, you are agreeing to the following terms and conditions.

Terms and Conditions of entry:

1. Films must be submitted on CD or DVD format and must be clearly marked with the title of the entry, the entrant's name and address.
2. All entries must be in English or English narrated or subtitled.
3. All entries must have been produced after 31 August 2009.
4. Entry form and media must reach SCINEMA by 5pm 30th April 2010.
5. All original entries will be retained by SCINEMA.
6. Each entrant is responsible for their own transit insurance, if required.
7. Confirmation of receipt of entry will be emailed - please provide an email address.
8. A film review panel will be selected by SCINEMA, and this panel shall decide which entries make it to the final judging round - these films will screen as part of the 2010 SCINEMA Film Festival, where the winning film in each category shall be determined by jury and audience vote. Voting categories shall be posted on the scinema website in 2010.
9. The jury's decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
10. If a winning production(s) is a group entry, the group will decide how prizes will be divided. Our prize of travel to a CSIRO field study site is limited to one winner, and a parent or guardian. A winning group will have to draw straws to see who goes - though we will offer the tour prize to a winning group, but we will only subsidise travel and accommodation for a single winner and the chaperone.
11. Further prizes are being confirmed and will be announced on this website in 2010.
12. Copyright resides entirely with the artist(s). Please ensure you have obtained all releases necessary for the public exhibition of your work. As these are student works, please ensure you have obtained permission from students and/or their parents to use their image in your films. SCINEMA asks you to provide a photograph from your production to use in marketing the festival - and it is essential that you have cleared permission for any images of children that you send to us. SCINEMA will not be held responsible for any breach of copyright.
13. Entrants shall allow clips or images from their works, or the works in their entirety, to be reproduced by radio, newspaper, television and the internet for promotional purposes.
14. Entrants wishing to withdraw from SCINEMA must inform SCINEMA by 15th May 2010.
15. It is the responsibility of the entrant to inform SCINEMA of any changes of address or contact details.
16. Entries may be shown under the SCINEMA banner for non-profit screenings by CSIRO and SCINEMA worldwide
